

What Is Being Done Now?

- Acceptable Use Policies Typically:
 - Cover Internet Use at School
 - Protect Students
 - Regulate Email Use
 - Limit Information Sharing
 - Require Avoidance Of Unacceptable Sites

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Present Practices Are Inadequate

There Is An Explosion Of Communication

- Website and Webpage Creation
- Cell Phone Pictures (Other Cameras)
- iPod, MP3 File Sharing
- Text Messaging

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Time To Take Action

For School Staff, Student, Parents

- Policy
- Training
- Enforcement
- Ministry (Christian Values, Addiction)

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Policy

- Revise Code Of Conducts or Community Life Policies
 - Include “Purposeful Acts” Such As Publishing Inflammatory Or Derogatory Statements About Individuals Or Institutions.
 - General Enough To Include Cyber Bullying Activities (Not Just Smoking Or Drinking Anymore!)

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Policy

- Acceptable Publishing Standards For Staff Including:
 - Personal Blogs
 - Social Networks
 - Photos and Videos
- Appoint Or Create An Oversight Board Who Will Be Charged With Determining “Inappropriate” Material

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Policy

- Determine What Is “Public Domain”
 - May Parents Post Pictures Of Other Children?
 - May Students Give Other’s Addresses Or Names?
 - May Teachers Post School Information On A “For Profit” Site?
- Imitating, Spoofing Or Representing Someone Else
 - Social Networking Sites Representing Others

 - Cyber Ethics - What Is Moral




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Training

- Student (cont.)
 - Clear Expectations

 - The power of the tongue and your expectations

 - * How To Report It
 - * Consequences If Participating In
 - Expectations when mentioning School, teachers, others in authority
 - Forwarding illegal or immoral material
 - › File Sharing
 - › Pornography
 - › Etc.
